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- ☐ Were permissions granted by other publishers or authors if required and the necessary documentation given to the Managing Editor (submit form(s) and/or documents to Managing Editor no later than 5pm on Tuesday, July 17, 2007)? - ☐ Have you updated/completed all of your contact information on the AIP PXP site (<http://cec-icmc.peerx-press.org>)?

### General Information

Once accepted, AIP will publish your paper as received – this is different from journal publications. **AIP does not copyedit or typeset your paper.** Therefore it is imperative that you adhere to all formatting requirements and double check and proofread your paper carefully before submitting it at the special web submission site.

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- Length of your paper: Contributed submissions (regardless of whether they are oral or poster presentations) will be allocated 8 (eight) pages. Invited contributions will be allocated up to 10 (ten) pages. Plenary contributions will be allocated up to 20 (twenty) pages.
